



- ❖ Call the Teacher Education Office at Ottawa University Kansas City for advising information.
- ❖ This degree is state of Kansas and NCATE approved.
- ❖ Certification applicants should consult with the Director of Teacher Education at Ottawa University Kansas City. The initial process includes transcript review, an interview and completion of the course The Teaching Profession with a grade of "C" or better. After completing these steps, students will need to apply to the Teacher Education Committee for admission to the program. To be eligible for recommendation for a teaching certification in Kansas a student must:
 1. Successfully complete the student teaching experience.
 2. Attain an overall grade point average of 2.5 or higher, with grades of "C" or better in subject area courses and professional education courses.
- ❖ Students must receive passing scores on the PPST: 173 in reading, 172 in writing and 172 in mathematics prior to student teaching.
