- ❖ Transfer students seeking admission to Washburn University must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0.
  - ❖ Courses in the student's major discipline do not fulfill general education requirements.

**General education group requirements for specific bachelor's degrees are as follow:**

- **Bachelor of Arts Degree:** 15 hours in Arts and Humanities with at least 3 of those hours selected from the area of Art, Music or Theater, with the remaining hours from at least two other disciplines; 12 hours in Natural Sciences and Mathematics, including credit hours from at least two disciplines other than Mathematics; 15 hours in Social Sciences. No more than 6 hours may be counted for General Education credit in any one discipline except Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Math, where up to 8 hours may be counted if earned in two separate General Education courses. Student must complete the 102 level course, or equivalent, in one of the languages offered by the Department of Modern Languages with a grade of "D" or better or a "Pass" in order to fulfill the foreign language requirement. Coursework taken to fulfill this requirement will not be applied toward general education requirements.
- **Bachelor of Business Administration, Bachelor of Integrated Studies, Bachelor of Public Administration Degrees:** 15 hours in Arts and Humanities with at least 3 of those hours selected from the area of Art, Music or Theater, with the remaining hours from at least two other disciplines; 12 hours in Natural Sciences and Mathematics, including credit hours from at least two disciplines other than Mathematics; 15 hours in Social Sciences. No more than 6 hours may be counted for General Education credit in any one discipline except Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Math, where up to 8 hours may be counted if earned in two separate General Education courses. Candidates for the Business Administration degree cannot use Economics courses to fulfill general education requirements. Candidates for the Bachelor of Integrated Studies degree cannot use the courses identified as satisfying the Individualized Study Program (ISP) or the Multidisciplinary Study Program (MDSP) to fulfill general education requirements.
- **Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice, Bachelor of Legal Studies Degrees:** 12 hours in Arts and Humanities with at least 3 of those hours selected from the area of Art, Music or Theater, with the remaining hours from at least two other disciplines; 12 hours in Natural Sciences and Mathematics, including credit hours from at least two disciplines other than Mathematics; 12 hours in Social Sciences. No more than 6 hours may be counted for General Education credit in any one discipline except Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Math, where up to 8 hours may be counted if earned in two separate General Education courses.
- **Bachelor of Education Degree:** Majors should consult advisors at Washburn for specific course requirements. 785-670-1427
- **Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Bachelor of Health Science, Bachelor of Music with a major in Education or Performance Degrees:** 9 hours in each of the three distribution groups with courses selected from at least two disciplines in each group, to included 3 hours in Art, Music or Theatre within the 9 hours of Arts and Humanities. Please contact the School of Nursing at 785-670-1525 for specific general education requirements. For the Bachelor of Science Degree all coursework taken to meet the concentration in Natural Sciences must be a grade of "C" or better.
- **Bachelor of Social Work Degree:** 15 hours in Arts and Humanities with at least 3 of those hours selected from the area of Art, Music or Theater, with the remaining hours from at least two other disciplines; 12 hours in Natural Sciences and Mathematics, including credit hours from at least two disciplines other than Mathematics; 15 hours in Social Sciences. No more than 6 hours may be counted for General Education credit in any one discipline except Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Math, where up to 8 hours may be counted if earned in two separate General Education courses.
- **Bachelor of Applied Science Degree:** 12 hours in Arts and Humanities with at least 3 of those hours selected from the area of Art, Music or Theater, with the remaining hours from at least two other disciplines; 12 hours in Natural Sciences and Mathematics, including credit hours from at least two disciplines other than Mathematics; 12 hours in Social Sciences with specific course requirements in each of the distribution areas (see catalog). No more than 6 hours may be counted for General Education credit in any one discipline except Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Math, where up to 8 hours may be counted if earned in two separate General Education courses.
