Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice

Transfer Program to Washburn University

2+2 PLAN (Partnership for Learning And Networking) is an online Bachelor's Degree Completion Program offered cooperatively by Washburn University and Johnson County Community College. This high-quality, flexible program allows a student with an associate's degree to complete a bachelor's degree in just two years without relocating. Students may start the program any semester. Tuition for the 2009-2010 school year is \$258 per credit hour, regardless of residency. Students who meet the scholarship requirements are eligible for scholarship consideration.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Apply for admission, including \$20 application fee (non-refundable). Complete the application online at www.washburn.edu/admissions

- Academic good standing; minimum cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0

REQUIREMENTS FOR BACHELOR'S DEGREE:

- Minimum of 124 semester hours of credit
- Minimum of 60 semester hours from Washburn or a four-year college or university; at least 30 hours must be completed through Washburn
- Minimum of 45 semester hours of credit from courses at the upper division level
- Minimum of 84 graded hours
- Grade of C or better in courses counting towards the university requirements and toward the major
- Associate's degree

Special Notes for the A.A., ADMJ student

A.A., ADMJ students automatically complete SPD 120 “Interpersonal Communication”, PHIL 143 “Ethics”, FL 130 “Elementary Spanish I”, leaving only 3 hours of any Art, Music or Theater course to complete as one of the A.A., ADMJ electives (to be completed fourth semester).

III. Mathematics and Natural Sciences (12 hours)

At least two science courses must be completed.

Select science/math courses from the JCCC
A.A degree requirements

Select from astronomy, physics, chemistry, biology,
physical science, geology, meteorology, mathematics

NOTE: MA 171 College Algebra at
JCCC will not count towards this requirement.

Special Notes for the A.A., ADMJ student

A.A., ADMJ students are required to complete 6 hours of Science and/or Math electives during the third semester and 3 hours during the fourth semester. WU strongly suggests an ADMJ student complete MA 175 “Discrete Math and Its Applications” OR MA 171 “College Algebra” during one of these semesters. The other semester should be spent completing a science course. Doing so will leave an ADMJ student with a balance of 3 hours in math/natural science general education area, which can be completed with Washburn University.

IV . Social Sciences (12 hours)

No more than six hours in one discipline.

Select from anthropology, economics, history
psychology, sociology, political science,
geography.
Select social science courses from the JCCC
A.A. degree requirements

Special Notes for the A.A., ADMJ student

A.A., ADMJ students required to complete POLS 124 “American National Government” OR
POLS 126 “State and Local Government” AND/OR PSYC 130 “Introduction to Psychology” AND/OR
SOC 122 “Introduction to Sociology” OR SOC 125 “Social Problems”. Any number of these courses fit
within the social science general education area.

A.A., ADMJ students automatically complete ADMJ 127 “Criminology”, which transfers to Washburn
University as a social science general education course and not a lower division criminal justice course.
This course fulfills the Criminal Justice Criminology requirement at Washburn University.
