TRANSFER ADMISSION PROCEDURES/QUALIFICATIONS

Application:

- Application is available online at www.webster.edu/kc/admissions.shtml or at the campus.
- \$35 nonrefundable application fee is required, payable online by credit card or by check or money order at the campus.
- Request official transcripts from ALL previous regionally accredited colleges and universities to be sent to the KC campus by mail.
- A short (300-500 word) essay on a topic of your choice, or a recent résumé should accompany your application.
- Students may apply any time; Webster University-KC's terms begin in January, March, June, August and October. We offer evening classes only.
- Transfer students are welcome to visit the campus anytime, 9 a.m.-7 p.m., Mon.–Thurs., 9 a.m.-2 p.m. on Fridays, and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.

BA-MANAGEMENT APPLICANTS:

- Contact an academic advisor for an appointment. Bring unofficial or official (in a sealed envelope) transcripts if possible.

International Students:

- All non-U.S. citizens, other than permanent residents, should contact International Student Recruitment and Services at www.webster.edu/iris/index.shtml for information regarding requirements.

Readmission:

- Any student who has been accepted to Webster University, has earned credits and has stopped out for one year or more, must apply for readmission. A student must be in good standing with Webster and pay a \$35 readmission fee. Coursework taken while the student was away from Webster must meet the Transfer Qualifications below.

Transfer Qualifications:

- This is a degree completion program. Students should have 3-4 semesters of college work from a regionally accredited college or university with a 2.0 (out of 4.0) or better GPA.
- For RNs, the minimum GPA acceptable by the Nursing Department is 2.5 out of 4.0.
- Courses with a grade of A, B, C or D will transfer as credit; however, courses with the grade of D will not count toward General Education courses. In the BA-Management, one grade of D is acceptable toward core course requirements in the major.
- Courses must be numbered 100 level or above to transfer.
- ACT or SAT scores are not required for transfer students.
- Official evaluation is based on official transcripts from previous accredited institutions.

TUITION/FEEES/EXPENSES FOR THE 2009-2010 ACADEMIC YEAR

Tuition and Fees:

- Undergraduate tuition is \$375 per credit hour.
- Undergraduate online courses are \$550 per credit hour.
- Textbook costs vary, depending on the course.
- There is a \$50 graduation fee.

FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Application Deadline:

- Students may apply for Financial Aid in the form of loans at any time of the year.
- For Pell grants (need-based) the preferred deadline is March 1. Other grants may be available if the student is a dependent.
- When filling out the FAFSA, Webster's code is #002521.

TRANSFER CREDIT/GRADING POLICIES

Application of Credit:

- The BA or BSN at Webster requires 128 credits, 2.0 out of 4.0 GPA or better (2.5 out of 4.0 for Nursing), and completion of general education requirements and the core courses in the major.
- The AA Degree meets **all** Webster University's general education requirement.
- The AS, AAS and AGS degrees generally meet between three and six of the nine general education requirements; students may finish their general education courses at Webster.
- Up to 98 credits may be transferred to Webster University if they are part of the completed associate of arts degree (not taken after the degree is awarded). Beyond the associate of arts (or AAS, AS, AGS), additional transfer credits are restricted.
- Other transfer credits may be acceptable: Standardized tests (CLEP, DANTES, etc.), and/or extra-institutional credits (military and corporate training recognized by the American Council of Education), for example.
- Webster's residency requirement: a minimum of 30 of the last 36 credits before graduation.
- Credit for Experiential Learning is available at Webster University-KC.
