TRANSFER ADMISSION PROCEDURE/QUALIFICATIONS
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Application:

A prospective student must:

- Interview with a DeVry admissions representative and complete an application for admission.
- Be 17 years old on or by the first day of class.
- Have an approved high school diploma or an approved General Education Development (GED) certificate.
- Successfully complete DeVry's placement test (developed by College Boards), provide acceptable ACT/SAT scores or transfer credits from another college or university.

Special criteria for select programs:

- Applicants to the Technical Management and Management programs must have successfully completed at least 12 semester credits at an approved post-secondary institution.

Special criteria for students intending to enroll in accelerated and/or online coursework:

- Own or have off-campus access to a specific type of PC meeting campus- or program-based requirements, including internet access.

International Students:

DeVry campuses are authorized by the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) to accept and enroll nonimmigrant students. Credit earned at a foreign institution must be externally evaluated as to the nature of the institution, level of the course, the semester credit hour equivalent and the final grade. Prior to the issuance of ICE Form I-20AB, nonimmigrant applicants must:

- Provide a certified copy of high school or college transcripts, or the equivalent, documenting the required level of prior education.
- Provide a notarized statement of financial support or a certified government sponsor letter indicating that tuition will be paid in advance of each term and that a sponsor will provide all necessary living expenses for the international applicant.
- Meet all other DeVry admission requirements.
- Meet requirements outlined in Admission of non-native speaking of English, if applicable.

DeVry is also authorized to accept and enroll international applicants who wish to transfer to DeVry from other U.S. institutions. In addition to providing the items listed above, transfer applicants must:

- Notify the current institution of their intent to transfer.
- Submit to DeVry the I-20AB issued by the school from which they are transferring in order to have DeVry issue a new one.
- Return the newly issued I-20AB to DeVry at registration.

Resumption of Study:

- Students who return after an interruption of studies should note that course availability might vary by term. Because program requirements may change periodically, an academic advisor will assess returning students' academic records to determine whether an alternate plan of study is required. Alternate plans may result in additional coursework requirements and tuition obligations.
- Resuming students who have missed at least three complete semesters must request readmission through standard admission procedures. Those who have missed fewer than three semesters must sign an enrollment agreement addendum. All students must be current in their financial obligations to DeVry prior to returning.

Placement Testing Requirements:

- Applicants must successfully complete DeVry's placement test (developed by College Board), provide acceptable ACT/SAT scores, or transfer credits from another college or university.

Transcript Qualifications and Evaluations:

- An applicant seeking to transfer credit from another institution must request a transfer credit evaluation prior to the first semester at DeVry and must provide an official transcript from the institution where the credit was earned. DeVry may require additional material.
- External courses must have been taken at an approved postsecondary institution, and must have been college-level courses offered for college credit by that institution.
- All evaluation is based on semester hours of credit. Quarter credit hours are converted as follows: $QCH \times (.67) = \text{Semester Credit Hours}$.
- As with any educational institution, DeVry retains full discretion in the awarding of external transfer credit. The assurance that the transfer student is prepared to proceed to higher level courses at DeVry and the integrity of the body of knowledge expected of a DeVry graduate are important considerations, in addition to the service extended to the transfer students by the recognition of their prior achievements.

TUITION/FEES/EXPENSES FOR THE 2009-2010 ACADEMIC YEAR

Tuition and Fees:

- \$550 per credit hour for less than 12 hours a semester. \$330 per credit hour for any credit 12 and above per semester.
- For students enrolled in the Electronics and Computer Technology degree charges are: \$570 per credit hour for less than 12 hours a semester. \$340 per credit hour for any credit 12 and above per semester.
- U.S. military personnel serving in any of the five branches of the U.S. Armed Forces (including National Guard and Reserves), and their spouses, are eligible for DeVry's military pricing.
- A student services charge of \$20 per session

Books and Supplies:

- Cost for textbooks and supplies vary by program and typically range from \$340 to \$970 per semester for full-time students.

FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Application

Process/Deadline:

- The FAFSA can be filed either in paper format or electronically at fafsa.ed.gov. It should be filed within two weeks of application for admission and must be re-filed each year.

Scholarship

Opportunities:

- Applicants holding associate degrees from public community colleges are eligible to apply for partial tuition scholarships, in the amount of \$1000 (valued up to \$6000) per semester (for full-time status), which are applied to any of DeVry's baccalaureate programs. Eligibility requirements include a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or higher on a 4.0 scale in the prior associate degree program. Must have applied and started with DeVry University within one year of the official college graduation date. Scholarships are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis and apply to tuition costs only.

TRANSFER CREDIT/GRADING POLICIES

Application of Credit:

A minimum portion of the program requirements must have been met through coursework successfully completed in attendance at DeVry. This portion excludes proficiency and external credits. The minimums follow:

- For programs of 30 through 120 credit hours, the required minimum is 30 credit hours;
- For programs of greater than 120 credit hours, the required minimum is 25% of the program's Total credit hours, rounded down (e.g., residency for program of 123 credit hours is 30 credit hours)
- A maximum of 80 DeVry semester hours of credit may be awarded for lower division or community college courses, subject to the residency requirement. This includes all lower division or community college transfer credit whether specialty or general education and support courses from all colleges attended.

Acceptable Grades:

- Courses eligible for transfer must have been completed with a grade of "C" (70%) or better. Pass/Fail grades are not acceptable for transfer credit.

Time Limit on Credit:

- Time limits may be imposed for acceptance of courses whose content has undergone significant change

Repeat Policy:

- The highest graded attempt of a course replaces all other grades in the cumulative grade point average computation.

Credit Given For:

- Approved nationally normed tests (e.g., AP, CLEP, DANTES) may be recognized for proficiency credit.
- Military coursework will be evaluated according to the criteria of the American Council on Education (ACE)
- Proficiency examinations: Students who feel course material has been mastered, either through courses taken at another school for which transfer credit cannot be given, or through self-study, may request a proficiency examination for the course, provided the student was not previously enrolled in the course at DeVry. Proficiency examinations must be taken prior to the end of the course drop period.
- DeVry does not grant academic credit for life experience.

GPA Calculation and Graduation Requirements:

- Transfer and proficiency credit fulfill graduation requirements. Transfer credit that is awarded is posted as "transfer credit" on the student's transcript, and is not calculated into the grade point average.
