TRANSFER ADMISSION PROCEDURES/QUALIFICATIONS

Application:

- Application packet is available online at [www.ccis.edu/nationwide/apply/appchooser.asp?kansascity](http://www.ccis.edu/nationwide/apply/appchooser.asp?kansascity) or at the campus.
- Required \$35 nonrefundable application fee is payable online by credit card or cash or check at the campus.
- Request official transcripts from all previous regionally accredited colleges and universities to be sent to the campus by mail.
- Students may apply at any time. Terms begin in January, March, June, August and October. We offer evening and online classes.

Readmit Students:

- Any student who has been accepted to Columbia College, has earned credits, and has stopped out for one year or more, must apply for readmission. A student must be in good academic and financial standing with Columbia College. Coursework taken while the student was away from Columbia College must meet the transfer qualifications below.

Transfer Qualifications:

- Transcripts must be received by Columbia College in a sealed envelope in order to be considered official.
- Courses with a grade of A, B or C will transfer as credit; courses with a grade of D, F or W will not be considered.

ACT/SAT Scores:

- ACT or SAT scores are not required for transfer students.

Transcript Evaluations:

- Potential transfer credit cannot be awarded/posted until all official transcripts have been received.

## FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

### Application Deadline:

- Students may apply for Financial Aid in the form of loans at any time of the year. For Pell grants (need-based) the preferred deadline is March 1. Other grants may be available if the student is a dependent.

### Special Requirements:

- Columbia College's FAFSA code is #002456.

### Benefits for Veterans, Military Personnel and Spouses

- Accepts veterans' GI Bill benefits and offers courses of study that have been approved for the GI Bill.
- Awards transfer credit by evaluating Military Qualification Records.
- Charter member of the Servicemembers Opportunity Colleges (SOC) consortium and accepts the direct transfer of specific college credits earned from other institutions within SOC.
- Member of Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) and provides courses that meet CCAF general education requirements.
- Participates in Troops to Teachers, a DAN TES program that assists military personnel in becoming certified and employed as elementary school teachers.
- All Columbia College degree programs have been approved for financial assistance through the MyCAA program. Called the My Career Advancement Account (MyCAA), the program provides up to \$6,000 in tuition assistance (TA) for military spouses to pursue degree programs, certifications, licensure and credentials.

## GENERAL ACADEMIC INFORMATION

- Each bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 credit hours and a minimum 2.0 of 4.0 GPA.
- The AA degree meets all Columbia College general education requirements.
- The AS, AAS and AGS degrees generally meet half of the general education requirements. Students may finish their general education courses at Columbia College.
- Out of the last 36 hours of your degree program, 24 hours must be taken through Columbia College. Students may transfer in as many credits as they need to complete their degree.
- Standardized tests (CLEP, DAN TES, etc.) and military training credit may also be accepted.
