TRANSFER ADMISSION PROCESS

Students who hold an Associate of Arts Degree from JCCC are considered to have fulfilled all UCM General Education requirements, except:

- ❖ Personal Interaction: This may be fulfilled with appropriate transfer courses (see JCCC recommended electives).
- ❖ Integrative Studies: This requirement is fulfilled by ICAP 4357 that must be taken through UCM.
- ❖ Any major required course not previously taken. These are noted below.

For students with an associate degree other than the Associate of Arts or who have not completed the AA, transfer courses are evaluated on a course-by-course basis.

- Requirements:
1. Attend an accredited college and/or university.
 2. Have a grade point average of “C” (2.0) or better and **24 or more** college credit hours. Applicants with a GPA lower than 2.0 will be considered on an individual basis and may be granted probationary status.
- Application:
1. Fully complete the application form. Applications are available at www.ucmo.edu/apply or can be requested from Central’s Office of Admissions.
 2. Return the application to the Office of Admissions with a **\$30** nonrefundable application fee.
 3. If the number of college credits is less than 24 hours, request that official high school transcripts and ACT or SAT scores be mailed directly to the Office of Admissions.
 4. Request **official transcripts** from all colleges and universities attended be mailed directly to the Office of Admissions.
- Application deadline: Rolling.
- ACT/SAT Scores: Not required for admission to the University for transfer students with 24 or more credit hours.
- Campus Visits: Students are invited to visit campus Monday through Friday 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Special visit days are also available and consist of information on admission, scholarships, financial aid, housing, student life and lunch with faculty. To schedule, call 1-877-729-8266.
- Enrollment: Once students are accepted, they should view the online Virtual Orientation Program. The VOP is designed to familiarize transfer students with campus resources and prepare them for an academic advisement appointment. Upon successful completion of the VOP, students will be provided the number to the Academic Advising Center. Access the VOP at www.ucmo.edu/VOP.

Academic Fees:	<u>Missouri Resident</u> \$195.30 per credit hour	<u>Non-Resident</u> \$390.60 per credit hour
Stateline Grant:	University of Central Missouri will allow students from contiguous counties in Kansas to pay the equivalent of in-state fees . The Stateline Grant is only applied to courses taught on the Warrensburg Campus. This program is available to any student who resides in one of the 10 contiguous Kansas Counties and is eligible for admission to University of Central Missouri. Participating Kansas counties include Doniphan, Atchison, Leavenworth, Wyandotte, Johnson, Miami, Linn, Bourbon, Crawford and Cherokee. To qualify, complete an undergraduate application for admission indicating your county of residence.	
Housing:	Residence halls: \$2,060 double occupancy/\$2,660 single occupancy. Apartments range from \$245-\$597. Most include cable TV, Internet, local phone, water, sewer and trash.	
Meal Plan:	\$1,100 per semester with three plans to choose from. Additional options are available for upper class students.	
Books:	Approximately \$200 per semester.

TRANSFER CREDIT/GRADING POLICIES

Credit Hours:	To receive a degree from Central, all students must earn: 120 credit hours, 30 senior hours (3000-4000 level), 15 senior hours in major, 20 hours from Central, final 12 hours from UCM.
GPA Calculation:	Calculation of GPA for the bachelor's degree includes grades from course work completed at Central and transfer credit.
Pass/Fail:	Not acceptable for general education courses or courses in major.
"D" Grades:	Contact the academic department for specific information regarding its program.
Time Limit:	No time limit on age of credit earned.
Credit Given For:	Experience based on education (through test-out procedures), military experience, department proficiency exams, independent study and CLEP (maximum 30 hours: 24 hours general).
