



- ❖ Criteria for admission to the Teacher Education Program at MNU:
 - Acceptable, formal application to the Teacher Education Program.
 - Two satisfactory recommendations by full-time faculty members.
 - At least 28 semester hours of college course work (exclusive of developmental coursework).
 - A cumulative grade-point average of 2.75 in all program stipulated course work completed at the time of application (this does not include OT Literature, NT Literature and Christian Beliefs).
 - “B” or better in English Composition I and Public Speaking, “C” or better in Intermediate Algebra (or demonstrated competency) and “B-” or better in all course work in the major.
 - No pending disciplinary probation.
 - No record of being convicted of a felony or crime involving dishonesty, a controlled substance, or a crime against a child.
 - The CBASE should be taken the first semester at MNU. Students who do not have passing scores on the CBASE may be limited on courses they are eligible to take. Passing scores are 235 or better in each category (Reading sub-test of the CBASE English test, Writing sub-test of the CBASE English test and Math Comprehensive).
 - Show proof of liability insurance at the time of registration for each semester.
 - Approval by the Teacher Education Committee.
 - Students are encouraged to contact Karen Bevis (kbevis@mnu.edu) at MNU early on for advising and transcript evaluation.
