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TRANSFER ADMISSION PROCEDURES/QUALIFICATIONS

Application:

- Application packet is available in the JCCC Student Center, 2nd floor, or MNU Office of Admissions or may be downloaded from the website, <http://www.mnu.edu/admissions/admit/htm>.
- \$25 nonrefundable application fee paid by check or money order may be mailed to the MNU Office of Admissions. Students may also pay online or in person.
- Request official transcripts from all previous colleges or universities to be sent directly to the MNU Office of Admissions by mail.
- Application deadline: Rolling.

International Students:

- Must apply 30 days prior to intended entry date if transferring from another college or university in the United States. Application fee is \$25.

Readmit Students:

- Readmission applies to any student who has completed at least one hour of credit at MNU and has missed one semester or more.
- Students should submit a reapplication form available from the MNU Office of Admissions.
- Readmission application fee: None.
- Students who applied to MNU and were accepted, but never attended, must reactivate their application through the MNU Office of Admissions.

Transfer Qualifications:

- Transfer students are defined as students who have earned 12 or more semester hours of credit. Transfer students are accepted in good standing if they have 24-55 semester credit hours and a cumulative GPA of 1.75 or better and meet ACT/SAT area score requirements. Transfer students who have 24 or more hours and a GPA of 2.00 or better are accepted in good standing.
- All courses on college transcripts will be included in the admission GPA computation.

ACT/SAT Scores:

- ACT or SAT scores are required for students transferring fewer than 24 hours of college work accepted by MNU. All education majors are required to have ACT or SAT mathematics results on file.

Recommendations:

- Submission of counselor/teacher reference, character reference, housing and health history forms is required. Student will be provided these forms at a later date.

Transcript Evaluations:

- Official evaluation is not made until all official transcripts are received.

Early Registration:

- Admitted transfer students are notified of pre-registration periods prior to each semester.

Campus Visits:

- Campus visits are available upon request through the MNU Office of Admissions.

	<u>Undergraduate Block Tuition (12-17 hours)</u>	<u>Tuition Per Credit Hour (Under 12 hours or over 17 hours)</u>
<u>Tuition:</u>	\$9,073 per semester	\$607/credit hour
<u>General Fee:</u>	\$400 per semester for on-campus students. \$265 per semester for off-campus students taking six hours or more.	
<u>Technology Fee:</u>	\$200 per semester for students taking six hours or more.	
<u>Residential Charge:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$3,226 per semester based on double occupancy/14 meals per week. • \$3,287 per semester, apartment/14 meals per week (reserved for upperclassmen). All unmarried students who do not reside with parents or guardians, and who are less than 22 years of age, are required to live on campus and eat in the cafeteria unless special arrangement has been made with the Office of Student Development.	
<u>Books:</u>	\$700-800 (approximately) per year.	
<u>Additional Expenses:</u>	Miscellaneous living expenses for travel, social activities, etc., vary by student.	

FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

<u>Application Deadline:</u>	• Financial Aid: March 1 (priority deadline).
<u>Special Requirements:</u>	• FAFSA and MNU application for financial aid.
<u>Transfer Scholarships:</u>	• Transfer students qualify for academic scholarships based on their ACT/SAT score unless they transfer in 56 or more credit hours, in which case their scholarship is based on incoming college GPA.

TRANSFER CREDIT/GRADING POLICIES

<u>Application of Credit:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In order to receive a degree from MNU, transfer students must take at least one year's work in residence (30 semester credit hours). • Transfer credit may be applied to general education requirements and those of specific majors and minors, subject to the approval of the responsible department.
<u>GPA Calculation:</u>	• Grades are transferred along with courses and count in the cumulative GPA.
<u>Pass/Fail:</u>	• Not acceptable.
<u>Retake Policy:</u>	• Each repetition of a course replaces the previous grade in the grade point average computation.
<u>"D" Grades:</u>	• Acceptable in general education courses, not for courses in the major.
<u>Time Limit on Credit:</u>	• No time limit on age of credit earned.
<u>Credit Given For:</u>	• Experience based education, military experience, department proficiency exams, independent study (not internship), CLEP (50th percentile) and PEP (business only).
