



- ❖ All students must apply for admission to the university *and* the Nursing major. Applicants for the Nursing major will be selected on factors such as cumulative GPA, number of credit hours taken at Avila, essay response, and/or interview, and patterns and trends in academic history indicating potential for success.
- ❖ The candidate for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree must maintain a "C" or above in all prerequisite courses, as well as achieve a cumulative grade point average of 2.5. Pre-Nursing courses may be repeated only one time. Prerequisite courses for Nursing are indicated by * below. Transfer students should contact Avila University concerning additional requirements and procedure.
- ❖ All nursing students must have current certification in basic BCLS health provider course, an annual TB test, health insurance, physical examination and meet immunization, performance standards and other agency requirements. Drug screening and criminal disclosure information may be required.
- ❖ A minimum of 64 semester hours must be completed at a four-year institution. The final thirty (30) hours must be completed at Avila University.

| III. LEVEL III — APPLICATIONS AND INTEGRATION (NO TWO-YEAR COLLEGE EQUIVALENT FOR LEVEL III) | |
