



Minimum number of credit hours for this degree is 128. At least 64 hours must be completed at a four-year school.

❖ Program Admission Requirements:

1. Acceptance to Avila University.
2. A limited number of students may be accepted into the program each year due to the capacity of the clinical sites. The number of positions available is calculated after the first-time, full-time freshmen have been admitted to the major.
3. All transfer students will go through an interview process after an application to the major is submitted. Transfer students are not guaranteed automatic acceptance after meeting the criteria.

❖ A candidate for the major must meet the following criteria:

1. Cumulative minimum college GPA of 2.5.
2. A "C" or above is required for all courses in the major. Any course may be repeated only once.
3. Completion of all prerequisites and sophomore standing.
4. Documented four-hour clinical observation.

❖ Students accepted into the program are required to have health insurance coverage and a completed health analysis, to pass a drug and alcohol screening and to undergo an extensive national background check prior to starting at the clinical site.

<b>III. LEVEL III — APPLICATIONS AND INTEGRATION (NO TWO-YEAR COLLEGE EQUIVALENT FOR LEVEL III)</b>
Interdisciplinary courses are courses that cross disciplines from any two or more areas of the university and taught at the 310 level or above. They reflect the unique talents and interests of the faculty, use primary sources, address university outcomes and emphasize higher level thinking skills. Students may register for Level III courses only after completing Level I requirements and 15 credit hours of Level II requirements.

Credit/No Credit Policy: No major courses specifically required for the major may be taken CR/NC. No more than 12 hours of the CR/NC grade option are applied toward an Avila Degree. See Avila catalog for policy.

Communication Intensive (CI) requirements are determined by the number of credits accepted for transfer by Avila University. CI courses can only be completed at Avila University. Please see the Avila catalog for more information.
