



The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and requirements for specific majors at four-year institutions. The 33 hours of electives within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower level major courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 64 credit hours, the maximum number of hours from a community college that may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of courses.

- ❖ **These requirements are effective for all students whose first enrollment in an accredited college or university occurs in Fall 2009 or later.**
- ❖ Admission to the junior-level Block I portion of the elementary education program requires:
  - a. **Grade point average of 2.75 or higher in core courses noted below with "†,"** minimum PPST scores of 172 math, 173 reading, 172 writing, or CAPP scores of 55 math, 57 reading, sliding scale writing, and a 2.5 minimum cumulative GPA.
  - b. A grade of C or better in English Composition I and II, Public Speaking, Introduction to Teaching, Children's Literature, Survey of Exceptionality and Mathematics courses (\*).
  - c. At least junior level standing with 50 or more semester hours of general education before Block I courses begin.
  - d. At least 100 hours of supervised work experience with preschool through grade 12 students in schools or agencies that work with youth in advocacy roles.
  - e. An "Application to Block I" form submitted to the respective (Kansas City or Emporia) Elementary Education Advising Office by April 1 for the Summer or Fall Block I or November 1 for the Spring Block I. Admission to Teacher Education Requirements do not need to be met prior to submitting application; however, the requirements must be met prior to enrollment in Block I.
- ❖ Requirements for the Elementary (K-6) Education Major include a minimum of 136 credit hours.
- ❖ In addition to the Elementary Education licensure (K-6), licensure may be obtained, with additional hours, in the following areas:
