



The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is the general transfer degree that partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. degree may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and requirements for specific majors at four-year institutions. The 33 hours of electives within the A.A. degree allows students to complete additional general education and lower level major courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 64 credit hours. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of courses.

The B.S. in Apparel and Textiles offers two specializations: Apparel Design and Production, and Apparel Marketing. Apparel Design and Production prepares graduates for careers in design or product and line development, apparel manufacturing, plant management and quality assurance. The apparel marketing specialization prepares graduates for positions in manufacturing and retailing of apparel and textile products.

Students applying to the Apparel Design and Production specialization first are admitted to Apparel and Textiles, then apply for advancement into the specialization. Advancement into the Apparel Design and Production specialization is selective and requires meeting specified academic and performance standards. Students may complete requirements for a business minor concurrent with completion of requirements for the BS in Apparel and Textiles. - ❖ Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at accredited two-year colleges. The B.S. in Apparel and Textiles requires 125 semester credit hours; 62 semester credit hours can be applied from accredited two-year colleges. **More than 62 hours are listed below. Choose carefully.**
- ❖ Each student must complete at least 30 hours of resident credit at K-State.
- ❖ A minimum of 45 hours must be at a course level of 300 or higher.
- ❖ Students must complete 20 of the last 30 hours of resident credit at K-State.
- ❖ Letter grades are required. Courses with "pass" or "credit" in lieu of letter grade can apply only as unrestricted electives.
- ❖ Grades of "C" or higher are required in all "Professional Studies" courses.
- ❖ All K-State students are required to complete a specific number of University General Education (UGE) credits at Kansas State University. The minimum number of UGE credit hours required is based upon the total number of completed transfer and advanced placement credit (AP, IB, CLEP, DANTES) credit hours accepted by Kansas State University.
