TRANSFER ADMISSION PROCEDURES/QUALIFICATIONS

Application:

- Application packet is available in the JCCC Student Center, 2nd floor, or K-State Office of Admissions.
- Online applications may be found at www.k-state.edu/admit/.
- \$30 nonrefundable application fee must be mailed, or credit card, debit card or electronic check payment is available for students applying electronically.
- Request official transcripts from all previous colleges or universities be sent directly to the K-State Office of Admissions by mail or faxed to 785-532-6393.
- Application deadline: Rolling; may be admitted up to 15 months before attendance.
- Architecture, Interior Design and Wildlife Outdoor Enterprise Management applications must be received and processed by February 1.

International Students:

- Must apply 3 months prior to intended entry date using international student application. For details see <http://consider.k-state.edu/admissions/international.htm>.

Readmit Students:

- Any undergraduate student who has previously been admitted and attended K-State needs to reapply and be readmitted using readmission application.
- Includes students who have not been enrolled for one or more semesters at K-State, been dismissed from the university one or more semesters, excluding summer, or graduates returning to continue further undergraduate work. Previously dismissed students must follow reinstatement procedures after filing for readmission.
- Readmission application fee: None.

Transfer Qualifications:

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale for admission to the University. All courses on college transcripts will be included in the admission GPA calculation.
- The following programs of study require higher GPAs: College of Architecture, College of Engineering, College of Business, Interior Design, Mass Communication (journalism), Psychology, all health-related professions, Athletic Training, all teacher education programs (does not apply to pre-professional education) and Wildlife Outdoor Enterprise Management. For specific program requirements, see the K-State catalog or transfer sheets for those programs.
- Transfer applicants who have earned less than 24 hours of transfer credit by the time they attend K-State must also submit an official high school transcript showing graduation date and ACT results if high school graduation was May 2001 or later.

ACT/SAT Scores:

- Not required for admission to the University for transfer students with 24 or more transferable credit hours. If applicant's age is 21 or older, ACT/SAT may not be required. Some programs may require these test scores for advising purposes.

Qualified Admissions:

- Effective Fall 2001, transfer students whose high school graduation date was May 2001 or later, with fewer than 24 transferable credit hours, must meet the conditions for high school graduates as shown in the K-State catalog and achieve a cumulative college GPA of 2.0. If applicant's age is 21 or older, ACT/SAT may not be required, depending on the state where high school graduation occurred.

Transcript Evaluations:

- Official evaluation is part of the admission procedure. Course equivalency information may be accessed at www.k-state.edu/admit/tran.html. Once a student is admitted, a Degree Audit may be accessed. Coming Soon: A student or advisor will be able to access a PDF of Transfer Advising Guide (TAG form). This will list most possibilities of course requirements by academic major. Ask K-State Transfer Coordinator for details! Use www.k-state.edu/admit/tran.html. Choose transfer equivalency, then select TAG curriculum.

Early Registration/
Campus Visits:

- Admitted transfer students are invited to a special early orientation and enrollment program for Fall 2011 on April 26 or 27 or June 14, 2011. Early enrollment and orientation for Spring 2011 students is November 17, 2010. Campus visits are available upon request. Special transfer visit days are scheduled for September 17 or November 12, 2010, and February 11 or April 16, 2011.

TUITION/FEE/EXPENSES FOR THE 2010-2011 ACADEMIC YEAR
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Tuition:

Kansas Resident: \$222.40/credit hour Non-Resident: \$590/credit hour

Campus Privilege Fee:

\$82.50 for the first credit hour plus \$24.50 for each additional credit hour to a maximum of \$341.75/semester.

Additional Fees for
Specific Programs:

- Architecture, Planning & Design, and Engineering equipment fee: \$19.00/credit hour
- Engineering and Business surcharge: \$20.00/credit hour
- A \$10 per credit hour college instructional support fee is included in tuition rates.

Room and Board:

- On-campus: \$6,800 (suite estimated) + \$30 application fee per year residence halls (includes meals and Internet)
- On-campus apartments (Jardine): \$520/month + electricity + cable + \$30 application fee (1 bedroom) Apply 9 months to 1 year in advance at www.housing.k-state.edu/jardine.
- Off-campus: Varies. Information for off-campus living is available through classified sections of the *Manhattan Mercury* at www.themercury.com or the *K-State Collegian* at www.collegian.ksu.edu, or visit <http://consider.k-state.edu/housing/otherhousing.htm> or ask the Transfer Coordinator for more details.

Books:

\$800-\$1,500 (approximately) per year. Textbook rental is an option.

Additional Expenses:

\$800-\$1,500 per semester (approximate). Miscellaneous living expenses for travel, social activities, football/basketball season tickets, parking permit, extra meals, etc., vary depending on the student.

FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

Application Deadline:

Financial Aid: March 1 Scholarship: February 1 (priority date)

Special Requirements:

- FAFSA for need-based aid.

Scholarship Application:

- Available online at <http://consider.k-state.edu/financialaid/transferscholarships.htm>. Students must be admitted and apply for scholarships by February 1 (priority date).

Transfer Scholarships:

- K-State Transfer Scholarship – Students transferring 24 or more credit hours and a cumulative GPA of 3.6 or higher will be eligible for a one-time \$2,000 to \$2,500 scholarship. The goal is to award this scholarship to every student who is eligible.
- Phi Theta Kappa All-Kansas Academic Team – \$2,500 non-renewable for Kansas Community College students nominated for the Phi Theta Kappa All-Kansas Academic Team or active Phi Theta Kappa members.
- K-State Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship – 10 non-renewable \$3,000 awards. Eligibility includes transfer of at least 24 hours, cumulative GPA of 3.75, nominated to All-Kansas Academic Team, enrollment at K-State immediately following attendance at community college.
- Students should check with individual departments for additional scholarship considerations.

TRANSFER CREDIT/GRADING POLICIES

Application of Credit:

- One-half of the hours required for a K-State baccalaureate degree may be taken at a two-year school.
- Application of transfer credit toward degree requirements is determined by each college and major department.

GPA Calculation:

- Calculation of GPA for the bachelor's degree includes only grades from those courses taken at K-State.
- The JCCC GPA will be considered for admission to certain programs and for transfer scholarship consideration.

TRANSFER CREDIT/GRADING POLICIES <i>(cont.)</i>

Pass/Fail:

- Each department or division may specify which courses its majors may take under the pass/fail option. Students should be aware that some schools, scholarship committees and honorary societies do not view nongraded course work favorably.
- See transfer sheets for policy of specific majors/schools or contact the department at K-State for clarification.

Retake Policy:

- Only the first repetition of a course replaces the original grade in the grade point average computation.
- Students wishing to retake a course originally taken at K-State must re-enroll and complete the same course at K-State.

“D” Grades:

- A grade of “D” will transfer to the University; however, these courses may need to be retaken, depending on the major entered.

Time Limit on Credit:

- No time limit on age of credit earned.

Credit Given For:

- Military experience, department proficiency exams, CLEP, AP, DANTES and Excelsior. K-State Office of Admissions has additional information (also on the KSU transfer equivalency website). For additional information go to www.k-state.edu/admit/tran.html.
