



The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 33 hours of electives within the A.A. allows students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 64 credit hours, the maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- ❖ Students wishing to pursue the BA in Architectural Studies degree must understand that this is **not** the professional degree for architecture practice. This program combines a liberal arts education with the study of the conceptual content of architecture and prepares students for any career that is enhanced by a knowledge of architectural history and theory or for graduate school in many fields.
- ❖ The curriculum does **not** include design studios.
- ❖ Application deadlines: October 1 (spring admission), February 1 (fall and summer admission).
- ❖ Only grades of "C" or better are accepted in transfer. Maximum 64 hours may be transferred from a community college. This degree is a 124-credit-hour program; 45 junior/senior level credit hours are required.
- ❖ Credit/No Credit - Acceptable for general education courses; not for ARCH courses.
