



- ❖ The B.S. in Architectural Engineering is an ABET (Engineering) accredited program offered jointly by the School of Architecture and Urban Design and the School of Engineering.
- ❖ Architectural Engineering is a 165-hour program that blends the study of basic science and engineering with the understanding of architecture and structural and mechanical systems. Architectural engineers work with and for architects to design and/or construct the engineered systems of buildings.
- ❖ Transfer students may be admitted, if space is available, if they have grades of C or better in MATH 241 and PHYS 220 and have minimum overall grade point average of 3.0.
- ❖ Students who wish to transfer graphics or design courses to the professional degrees may do so only upon **submission of a portfolio** of work done in such courses. Placement in the professional curricula will be based upon completed coursework and a review of the comprehensive portfolio of prior work in architecturally-oriented courses.
