



The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 33 hours of electives within the A.A. allows students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 64 credit hours, the maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- ❖ **The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences:** KU's largest academic unit with 53 departments and programs
- ❖ **Degrees Offered:** Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Science (B.S.), Bachelor of General Studies (B.G.S.).
- ❖ **Total Hours:** 124 hours minimum. No more than 64 hours from a two-year institution may be applied toward the 124 hour total. Must include 100 hours in liberal arts and sciences, 45 junior/senior hours; the last 30 of those hours must be at KU.
- ❖ **Credit/No Credit Policy:** Allowed for courses not in the major or minor. Not allowed for courses listed in the KU catalog under "Requirements for the Major" for each specific major. Students should be aware that some scholarship committees and honorary societies do not accept this grading system and convert grades of "No Credit" to F when computing grade-point averages.
- ❖ **Transfer Grades of "D":** Not accepted toward any degree in the College of Arts and Sciences.
