



- ❖ **These requirements apply to students entering the School of Business Fall 2003 or later.**
- ❖ The School of Business offers a Bachelor of Science in Business degree with seven majors available: Accounting, Business Administration, Finance, Information Systems, Marketing, Management and Leadership, and Supply Chain Management. In addition to the seven majors, the school offers four business concentrations in Information Systems, International Business, Human Resource Management or Entrepreneurship.
- ❖ The KU undergraduate business programs are offered in a traditional classroom-based format on the Lawrence campus, with very few options for evening or online courses.
- ❖ Applications to the University of Kansas may be obtained online at www.admissions.ku.edu, or through the KU Office of Admissions. For application deadlines, please see www.admissions.ku.edu/deadlines. Students should request official transcripts from all colleges and universities they have attended be sent directly to the KU Office of Admissions.

❖ In addition to applying for admission to the University, students must complete a separate application for the School of Business. Students who have not met the prerequisite requirements for the School of Business will be admitted to the College of Liberal Arts & Sciences and will apply to the School of Business when prerequisite requirements are satisfied. **JCCC students who will have completed all the prerequisite requirements before transferring, and wish to be considered for direct admission to the School of Business, should contact the KU advisor at JCCC to learn about the application process. Call (913) 469-8500, ext. 3232, for an appointment with the KU advisor.**

Application deadline for direct admission to the School of Business is February 15 for fall; September 15 for spring admission. Students should apply to the School of Business during the semester they will complete the admission requirements.

- ❖ **Minimum requirements to apply to the School of Business include:**
 - **Completion of at least 60 semester hours that include the following required pre-business coursework or equivalents: ACCT 200 Financial Accounting I, ACCT 201 Managerial Accounting I, DSCI 301 Statistics, ECON 142 Microeconomics, ECON 144 Macroeconomics, and IST 301 Intro to Information Systems.**
 - Pre-admission courses must be taken for a grade.
 - Students may only use courses with a grade of "C" or higher to fulfill requirements. This policy will begin with courses completed in the Fall 2008 semester and later. Courses with the grade of "D" or "F" will still be included in the overall GPA for admission, but will not satisfy requirements.
 - Repeat policies that apply at JCCC do not transfer to KU. All repeated courses will be calculated in the GPA when transferred to the university.
 - Elective courses only will be accepted with a grade of "P."
 - At least a 2.5 GPA in all college coursework, in all professional coursework (all business and economics courses), in coursework completed at KU, and in professional coursework (business and economics courses) completed at KU, excluding activity hours (physical education, choir, band, etc.).
- ❖ Only students meeting all of the above requirements at the time of application will be considered for admission to the School of Business. Because admission is competitive, meeting all of the requirements does not guarantee admission into the School of Business. In addition to the above courses, students are highly encouraged to complete PSYC 104 and one course from the social science Culture and Society group.
- ❖ Students meeting the minimum admission requirements who have also earned at least a "3.0" in all professional coursework are guaranteed admission into the School of Business. To receive this guarantee, students must take ACCT 200, 201 and DSCI 301 at the University of Kansas.
- ❖ A student may transfer a total of 64 hours of community college coursework to KU. Students with more than 64 hours of community college coursework will have increased graduation requirements. Students are required to complete 45 credit hours of junior/senior level coursework to satisfy graduation requirements.

IX. INTERNATIONAL DIMENSION REQUIREMENT (IDR)

Students entering college as freshmen as of Fall 2009 must satisfy requirements for the IDR to meet graduation requirements for the KU School of Business.

Option 1. Foreign Language

Complete through the fourth level (intermediate II) of a modern foreign language or earn proficiency as determined by the appropriate foreign language department. International students who have completed the English proficiency through the KU Applied English Center may use this to fulfill Option 1.

Option 2. International Studies

Six credit hours of courses completed in one or a combination of the following categories: (A) study abroad; (B) contemporary regional/international studies/international business.

- A. Study Abroad (credits from any study abroad program approved by KU).
- B. Contemporary regional/international studies/international business courses must be selected from a list of approved courses. Some may be double-counted to meet the General Education requirements. Courses in this category may be double-counted toward the corresponding business major and/or concentration.
