



The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 33 hours of electives within the A.A. allows students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 64 credit hours, the maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- ❖ **Admissions Requirements:** A total of sixty-two (62) semester hours of preparatory work in an accredited liberal arts college with a minimum grade point average of 2.5. Courses with grades of "D" or "F" do not count toward the 62 hours. Admission to the School of Nursing is competitive. - ❖ **Application Deadline:** At this time, only one class is admitted each year. To have an application considered, it must be completed and in the Office of Student Affairs by October 15th of the year preceding entry into the School of Nursing in August. If spaces are available in the class after all initial applicants have been reviewed, KU may accept contingency applications.
- ❖ **Pass/Fail Policy** – Not acceptable for JCCC courses.
- ❖ Sixty-four credit hours may be transferred to KU from community colleges. Students should be aware that 45 junior/senior credit hours are required for completion of the four-year degree; the last 30 of those hours must have been taken in residence at KU.

Electives can be chosen according to the student's particular interest or needs. A maximum of eight nonliberal arts credits will be accepted in the 62 hours required for admission. These eight nonliberal arts credits may be in physical education courses, applied courses, courses in other professional areas and technique courses in art, music and dance.
