



The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 33 hours of electives within the A.A. allows students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 64 credit hours, the maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools. Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

- ❖ Students desiring admission to the Kelce School of Business must meet the following admission requirements:
  - Completed 42 semester hours applicable to the degree the student is seeking.
  - Completed Composition I and College Algebra with a grade of C or better.
  - Obtained a cumulative GPA of 2.5 on all hours attempted.
- ❖ Programs in the School include the Bachelor of Business Administration with majors in accounting, economics, finance, information systems, management and marketing; and the Bachelor of Science in Computer Science.
- ❖ Students must have at least 60 hours from a four-year school. Forty-five credit hours must be upper division courses. Thirty hours must be completed at PSU.
- ❖ At least 50 percent of the business credit hours (i.e., the credit hours from the areas of accounting, economics, finance, management, marketing and information systems) that are required for the Bachelor of Business Administration degree must be earned at Pittsburg State University.
