TRANSFER ADMISSION PROCEDURES/QUALIFICATIONS

Application:

- Application may be completed online: www.umkc.edu/admissions.
- \$35 online application fee or \$45 paper application fee (non-refundable).
- Request official transcripts from all previous colleges or universities be sent directly to the UMKC Office of Admissions by mail. Students applying to transfer with less than 24 credit hours must submit a high school transcript with class rank and ACT score as well as official transcript of all college courses completed and courses in which student is currently enrolled.
- Priority admissions deadlines are as follows: Fall – April 1; Winter – November 1; Summer – May 1. Applicants are encouraged to apply well before admissions deadlines. To be considered for scholarships, students should apply before February 1. Refer to departments for special deadlines.

International Students:

- All international students should apply for admission (this includes taking all necessary tests, medical shots and filing all required application forms and academic records) by the following general deadlines: Fall – March 1; Spring – October 1; Summer – April 1. To be considered for assistantships and scholarships, students should apply by February 1. Application fee is \$50.
- International students must submit the international undergraduate admission application.
- Minimum score on the TOEFL is 500/173 CBT (computer based test) or minimum score on the ILTS is 5.5 for undergraduate admission.

Readmit Students:

- Any former student not enrolled at UMKC for the semester before the term in which they want to enroll, and who has not attended another institution, should complete a Request to Re-enroll form.
- Former students who attended another institution after leaving UMKC, use the criteria listed under “Transfer Qualifications.”

Transfer Qualifications:

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale for admission to the University. Students who do not have a 2.0 GPA may be admitted upon special petition to the Office of Admissions, provided the admission is approved by the academic unit.
- Admission GPA is calculated by averaging together all courses taken, including repeats, regardless of whether or not it is applicable to a degree.
- Admission requirements for some academic units may be more stringent. See the individual transfer sheets or UMKC catalog for requirements.
- Transfer students will be evaluated for admission solely on their college grades after completing 24 credit hours of college-level course work.

ACT/SAT Scores:

- Not required for admission to the University for transfer students with 24 or more credit hours. However, some programs may require these test scores.

Transcript Evaluations:

- Transfer students who have been admitted to UMKC receive an official credit evaluation.

Campus Visits:

- Special visit days for transfer students have been scheduled this academic year for Saturday, October 3, 2009, and Monday, February 13, 2010. Appointments may be scheduled to visit UMKC Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. by calling (816) 235-UMKC (8652).

TUITION/FEE/EXPENSES FOR THE 2008-2009 ACADEMIC YEAR

<u>Tuition and Fees:</u>	<u>Missouri Resident:</u> \$ 310.25 per credit hour <u>Non-Resident:</u> \$679.95 per credit hour
<u>Metro Rate:</u>	Effective Summer 2002, students who reside in the Kansas counties of Wyandotte, Johnson, Leavenworth or Miami will pay the same “in-state” rate as Missouri residents.
<u>Additional Fees:</u>	Certain majors or courses may require additional fees.
<u>Room and Board:</u>	On-campus: Varies by residence hall and meal plan, approximately \$8096. Students who live in the residence halls are required to have a meal plan. For information see www.umkc.edu/housing .
<u>Books:</u>	\$1000 (approximately) per year.
<u>Additional Expenses:</u>	Miscellaneous living expenses for travel, social activities, sports tickets, parking permit, extra meals, etc., vary depending on the student.

FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS

<u>Application Deadline:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Financial Aid: March 1 (priority)• Scholarship: Awarded on a first-come, first-served basis beginning October 1. Students must enroll in a minimum of 12 hours to qualify for academic scholarships.
<u>Special Requirements:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• ACT scores and FAFSA
<u>Scholarship Application:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• All incoming students who have applied for admission and meet the specified scholarship eligibility criteria are given automatic consideration for certain academic awards. Unless stated, no separate scholarship application is required. Recipients are notified of their selection by letter.
<u>Transfer Scholarships:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Transfer scholarships include the UMKC Transfer Scholar Award, Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship, Chancellor’s Transfer Award, Minority Student Scholarships, Curator’s Transfer Scholar Award and Victor Wilson Scholarship. See www.sfa.umkc.edu for a complete listing.

TRANSFER CREDIT/GRADING POLICIES

<u>Application of Credit:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The last 30 hours must be completed at UMKC.• Application of transfer credit toward degree requirements is determined by each major department.
<u>GPA Calculation:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Calculation of GPA for the bachelor’s degree includes only grades from those courses taken at UMKC.• GPA’s from all previous course work completed at other colleges may be considered for admission to the professional schools or certain programs at UMKC.
<u>Pass/Fail:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not available at UMKC but acceptable in transfer, for elective course work only. Pass/Fail is not acceptable for general education and courses required for the major.• Some schools, scholarship committees and honorary societies do not look favorably on ungraded course work.
<u>Repeat Policy:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• All grades shall be included in the GPA calculation.
<u>“D” Grades:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In general, courses with a grade of D will transfer. For some programs, a grade of D may not be used to satisfy specific requirements.
<u>Time Limit on Credit:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Credit over 15 years old at the time of application for graduation may not be counted toward the fulfillment of an undergraduate field of study or concentration unless validated to the satisfaction of the department or school/college.
<u>Credit Given for:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Credit given for some military courses, independent study, Advanced Placement and subject matter tests only with copy of report for CLEP.
